Northern Lights Canadian National Conservatory of Music provides a holistic approach to music study blending traditional teaching techniques with innovative, expert-developed methods, encouraging student skill development from performance etiquette to musicianship and performance, as well as theory. CNCM provides teachers and students flexible, engaging and creative programs for all levels of study - from beginner 'user friendly' exams to professional diplomas.

Northern Lights Canadian National Conservatory of Music currently offers four separate practical piano examination streams:

- 1. **Graded Piano Performance**, a unique format, offering candidates and teachers the experience of preparing recital programs shared with an audience of loved ones as selected by the student families love this opportunity!
- 2. **Graded Piano Workshop**, a more traditional format, involving a general conclusive discussion with student, teacher and parent
- 3. **Music for Everyone Programs** for young students to young-at-heart students in two different streams for first year to performance levels:
 i) *Northern Lights* Star Performance (mini personal recital)
 ii) *Northern Lights*Popular (performance, accompanying, transposition; lead sheet and improvisation)
- 4. **Piano Pedagogy**, a teacherfocused program, offering six diplomas ranging from Early Childhood Music Education to Senior Fellowship.



Northern Lights Canadian National Conservatory of Music provides students with the opportunity to set short term goals and enter examination programs even in their first year of study with the *Music for Everyone Programs*. The Music for Everyone Programs are ideal for adult students (all ages and levels), busy students, and students who are looking for opportunity to perform a shorter program as they prepare for more demanding examinations, auditions or graduating from their music studies.



Achieving a Complete Northern Lights Canadian National Conservatory of Music Grade

Northern Lights Canadian National Conservatory of Music is an incorporated not-for-profit organization which provides a substantive and rigorous curriculum for piano students across Canada.

The CNCM program is a holistic approach to piano study including performance, musicianship (technique, aural skills, sight reading, vocalization, harmonization, transposition, and improvisation), and co-requisite theory requirements. CNCM program requirements are equal to or exceed those of currently recognized Canadian conservatory programs at any given level.

Northern Lights Canadian National Conservatory of Music also promotes and supports Canadian music, as demonstrated through their publications of more than 30 all-Canadian piano collections from pre-reading to performance levels.

CNCM offers students a flexible approach in the completion of a piano level with three options:

OPTION 1 Piano Performance OR **OPTION 2 Theory** Musicianship **Piano Workshop Beginning in Grade 5** OR **Examination Standards include: OPTION 3**

Northern Lights Music for Everyone Popular Program AND Star Performance

- Honours (70-79%);
- First Class Honours (80 89%);
- First Class Honours with Distinction (90 -100%)

Students' work is assessed during a face to face OR online examination format with an appointed, highly qualified CNCM examiner. The assessment is prepared in a written format and is issued as a hard copy to the student's teacher. A hard-copy certificate is issued when all requirements are successfully completed within the required time limit of one academic year.

CNCM students build musical understanding and competence through research, the art of performance (personal recital format), musicianship skills, technique, and life-skills (oral presentation within the performance examination). A wide variety of musical styles is expected within the examination selections, including Canadian content.

CNCM Grade 2 Piano

The following graphics and charts illustrate the different streams, using the Grade 2 and Grade 6 levels as examples.

Piano Performance (20 minutes)

8 pieces including: Renaissance or Baroque, Rococo or Classical, Romantic, 20th-21st Century Idioms, Canadian, Etude, Candidate's Choice, Encore OR theme-based

Candidates perform for an audience, prepare a written programme with programme notes, and introduce each piece. 5 works must be memorized.

OR

Piano Workshop (25 minutes)

7 pieces including: Renaissance or Baroque, Rococo or Classical, Romantic or 20th-21st Century Idioms, two Etudes, two of Candidate's Choice

Candidates must perform at least one Canadian composition. Candidates will be required to answer musical knowledge questions about their pieces.

OR

Northern Lights Music for Everyone Fiess Level (35 minutes total)

Popular Program

- » Own choice or original composition (gr. 2 level)
- » Own choice with electronic accompaniment (gr. 2 level)
- » One Lead Line Sheet in the key of C, F or D major utilising I, IV, V harmony
- » Improvisation
- Transposition of a single line melody from C major to D major

Candidates must perform at least one Canadian work.

Star Performance

4 pieces at grade 2 level with contrast of tempo, meter, and style.

Candidates perform for an audience, prepare a written programme with programme notes, and introduce each piece.

Candidates must perform at least one Canadian work.

Memorization recommended but not required.

Musicianship

15 minutes

Aural: Identify time signatures, clap back a rhythm, play/singback a melody, identify major or minor scales, identify intervals within a 4-note chord, identify triads

Vocalization: Utilising solfège, sing a major 5-finger penta scale, sing and play a 5-finger melody

Sight Reading: Clap a rhythm at sight and perform a passage at sight

Transpose: a melody at

sight

+

Harmonization: a short melody with the I chord

Improvisation:

Complete a two measure phrase with an improvised melody

Technical

Requirements: Scales in a variety of forms, chords, and arpeggios

Theory *Not Required*

Although CNCM does not offer a co-requisite theory program at this level it is highly recommended that students develop a strong theoretical understanding

MUSICIANSHIP EXAMINATION REQUIREMENTS:

(for Grade Two Performance, Workshop and Music for Everyone Fiess Level (F Level))

Aural Components: (12 marks)

- i Identify the following melodic intervals:
 - major second (or step)
 - major third (or skip)
 - ascending or descending
- ii. Clap back the rhythmic pattern of a four-bar phrase as follows:
 - in ³ or ³ time
 - consisting of dotted half, half, dotted quarter, quarter and/or eighth note values
- iii. Identify a major or natural minor scale as follows:
 - · ascending and descending
 - at a moderate tempo
- iv. Identify a major or minor triad played once as follows:
 - broken form
 - root position (close)
- v. A major four-note chord will be played once as follows:
 - broken form
 - root position (close)
 - ascending and descending

One of the four notes will be resounded, and the *candidate* will be required to identify it as *doh*, *mi*, *sol* or *high doh*.

- vi. Play or sing back a short melody:
 - in C Major
 - using the first three notes of the scale
 - steps and skips will be included
 - beginning and ending on the tonic

The Northern Lights CNCM Aural Component was designed to provide teachers and students with a developmental aural skills curriculum. The program is progressive with each new component thoughtfully supported by previously learned materials.

ie identification of 'steps & skips' progresses easily to interval identification

Vocalization: (12 marks) (Candidates are not graded on voice quality)

- i. Candidates will sing and play:
 - a five-finger pattern, one hand **ONLY** in a major key
 - beginning on two different tonics of the candidate's choice
 - ascending and descending
 - using solfège (doh, re, mi, fah, sol, fah, mi, re, doh)
- ii. Candidates will sing and play at sight:
 - a two-bar melody in a C Major or D Major five-finger pattern
 - using solfège (doh, re, mi, fah, sol)

The Northern Lights CNCM Vocalization encourages students to use their voice to assist in the development of internalization of sounds. The voice quality is not being assessed; students simply need to make the effort to tone match, move their voice and identify solfège based on a moveable doh.

Sight Reading: (12 marks)

- i. Candidates must clap:
 - a four-bar passage in ³ or ⁴
 - using dotted half, half, dotted quarter, quarter and/or eighth note values
- ii. Candidates must perform a piano passage at sight. Fingering will be provided, and the passage will be divided between the hands. The passage will include some of the following criteria:
 - keys: C, D, G or F Major
 - time signatures: ¾ or ¼
 - note values: dotted half, half, quarters and eighth note values

Transposition: (10 marks)

- i. Candidates will be required to transpose at sight:
 - a short, five finger right hand melody
 - C Major to D Major; C Major to F Major; C Major to G Major

Harmonization: (10 marks)

- Candidates will harmonize a C Major, G Major or F Major five finger pattern melody as follows:
 - left hand close position triad
 - tonic triad only

Proper placement of chords will be marked by an "X"

Improvisation: (5 marks)

- i. Candidates will complete a two-measure phrase:
 - with two responding measures
 - ending on the tonic in C Major

Frequently asked questions regarding the *Northern Lights* Canadian National Conservatory of Music Practical Exams

How can I be sure the repertoire selected is at the required grade level?

Teachers are encouraged to reach out to the Office of the Registrar at registrar@cncm.ca free of charge for level assessment. In the case of the Music for Everyone levels A through C level assessment is not required; CNCM simply suggests that the repertoire be of a similar level.

How long does a student have to complete a full grade?

Students have 12 months to complete all the required credits to receive a full grade diploma.

What if my student advances more quickly than anticipated and is capable of moving to a new grade level before completing the previous grade?

CNCM students may 'mix & match' levels by opting to use a credit one level higher as part of their full grade diploma. (ie Grade 2 Performance + Grade 3 Musicianship = Complete Grade 2 if all credits were completed within the 12-month deadline)

Can my students opt for examinations to be scheduled anytime?

CNCM has always offered seasonal specific examinations in Winter, Spring and Summer, as well as special date requests. Since COVID-19, CNCM examinations have become even more flexible. Although current examination formats include online or video submission, in-person examinations will return in the future when and where it is possible. What themes are acceptable for performance examinations?

Themes can be based on everything from traditional to pop, jazz and rock. Students often develop a strong connection with a specific composer, or topics/interests such as animals, modes, travel, nature, etc. — it truly is open to the imagination. There are no restrictions other than the program must demonstrate contrast in key, metre, tempo and style and the Canadian component remains the same as a traditional examination.



Exam fees for *Northern Lights* Canadian Conservatory of Music are on par with other leading Canadian Conservatories.

Piano Workshop (30 minutes)

7 pieces including: Renaissance or Baroque, Rococo or Classical, Romantic or 20th-21st Century Idioms, two Etudes, two of Candidate's Choice

Candidates must perform at least one Canadian composition. Candidates will be required to answer musical knowledge questions about their pieces.

Northern Lights Music for Everyone Katya Level (30 minutes total)

Sight Reading: Clap a rhythm at sight and perform a passage at sight

Northern Lights Canadian National Conservatory of Music Theory and History Programs



Northern Lights Canadian National Conservatory of Music maintains a complete, comprehensive theoretical curriculum, including rudiments, grades 5 through 8, harmony, counterpoint, analysis and history, grades 9 through Associate. Each of these credits is a co-requisite to the practical examination program.

Typically, the examination format for these sessions are group situations at selected centres. However, CNCM allows small studios/groups to host theory/history examinations with the teacher as acting proctor. Private sessions are also possible upon request.

Examinations are offered at three exam sessions, February, May and August of the calendar year. Special date requests may be submitted, and upon approval from the examination board confirmations will be issued.

Certificates will be awarded upon the successful completion of each complete theoretical credit.

CNCM offers flexibility in the registration for credits in grades 9 through Associate theory credits.

Northern Lights Canadian National Conservatory of Music offers:

- a Rudiment program which carries similar in requirements to other Canadian conservatories
- a Harmony program which includes chorale style & piano accompaniment writing, counterpoint and basic analysis. The examination may be written as a complete examination or in 2-parts requiring completion within 12 months of the first examination.
- a History program which is progressive in nature and includes a listening component. The examination may be written as a complete examination or in 3-parts requiring completion within 12 months of the first examination.
- an Analysis program which carries similar in requirements to other Canadian conservatories

Northern Lights An Exploration of Canadian Piano Music Series

Northern Lights An Exploration of Canadian Piano Music is a graded series of piano solos produced by Northern Lights Canadian National Conservatory of Music. Although all works are Canadian the following substitutions may be made without pre-approval.

GRADE	SUBSTITUTION WITHOUT PRE-APPROVAL
Introductory through Grade Four General Performance	A maximum of TWO stylistic works. At least one of these works must be selected from the Northern Lights: An Exploration of Canadian Piano Music and substituted for period works. Example: Grade Five: Baroque style Prelude and Fugue may be included in lieu of a Baroque period work. All other works MUST be period appropriate.

Each diploma may be built credit by credit, allowing busy studio teachers an opportunity to study while gaining experience. Pedagogy candidates have the option of completing a full pedagogy diploma or choosing individual credits of interest. Each successfully completed credit is rewarded with a certificate to be shared with students and teachers within their studio to demonstrate ongoing professional development.



The **Early Childhood Music Education Diploma** is a five-credit program designed to develop a comprehensive understanding of pre-school children and music programs. Candidates will study early childhood psychology, available programs and may even develop their own pre-school music program.

The CNCM Coaching Class is a new and exciting learning experience for piano students, enabling them to work directly with CNCM examiners and adjudicators.


The benefits of participating in a CNCM Coaching Class are numerous:

The Northern Lights and Making Tracks collections are CNCM's flagship series. They are developed from submissions by Canadian composers from across the country. Currently, we have increased our production to 42 books, and published more than 168 Canadian composers; this includes a blend of well-known names along with many who were first published by CNCM and have now become widely known. A grand total of 936 pieces have now been produced by CNCM.

Northern Lights is a graded series of new and original piano music, exclusively Canadian. The solos series is a complete range, from pre-reader right through Grade 8. The Northern Lights Duet series has a total of five books, ranging from Primary through Intermediate levels.

To celebrate Canada's 150th Anniversary, we produced a fresh collection of O Canada arrangements; and two volumes of new

arrangements of Canadian Folksongs.

Making Tracks An Expedition in Canadian Piano Music is a series of piano repertoire rooted in our national railroad history and designed to:

- Provide Canadian and international students with sound pedagogical material for study purposes blended with Canada's rich railroad history
- Provide students with repertoire written in all genres from neo-Baroque to jazz by Canadian composers blended with Canada's rich railroad history
- Provide students with performance repertoire with audience appeal that is at the same time pedagogically sound and blended with Canada's rich railroad history
- Provide repertoire for performance, study, sight reading, examinations, and recreation
- Provide ideal Canadian music to festivals
- Create repertoire that could be used by any school of music
- Provide established and new Canadian composers with a voice by having their works selected for inclusion



Making Tracks An Expedition in Canadian Piano Music was originally launched in 2006. This was the first series created by CNCM in support of Canadian writers and performers. Making Tracks An Expedition in Canadian Piano Music series includes:

- Volume One nineteen piano solos by twelve Canadian composers spanning elementary to intermediate works
- Volume Two eleven intermediate to advancing piano solos and one piano duet (1 piano/4 hands) by ten Canadian composers
- 3. Volume Three contains four –two piano/four hands works by Marcel Bergmann, Marco Burak, Steve Hansen Smyth and Gordon Rumson
- 4. Volume Four: Making Tracks Small Town Canada An Expedition in Canadian Piano Music contains twenty-two piano solos by eighteen Canadian composers celebrating small towns and communities across Canada. (Intermediate Level)



5. Volume Five: Making Tracks Across Canada An Expedition in Canadian

Piano Music – contains twenty-two piano solos by seventeen Canadian composers
celebrating all things Canadian. (Intermediate to Advanced Level)

Each volume includes program notes, as well as composer biographies and photos. Volumes One and Two also include a short history of the railroad – written by Canadian composer Michael Dobinson.

Video Series

For the past few months *Northern Lights* Canadian National Conservatory of Music has been working on a new and exciting YouTube project. The pieces in the first series of videos are 'Winter' themed works written by Canadian composers. The piano solos are drawn from the CNCM *Northern Lights, Making Tracks* and Folksong series.

The videos also feature the debut of a fantastic new CNCM theme by Wes Froese and a message from Dale Donaldson on behalf of the CNCM Board.
