Graded music exams go digital

London College of Music Examinations (LCME) enables aspiring musicians to take online graded exams through innovative options which offer a new level of flexibility and convenience alongside a reliable, independent and regulated assessment for students.

Recorded Exams

Candidates record a performance at a time and place that suits them and upload the video to a newly developed, secure platform for assessment.

Available up to Grade 8, these exams incorporate discussion and technical work components.

Candidates can select performance pieces from the relevant LCME set list, or equivalent from another accredited body.

Online Exams

Candidates studying up to Grade 4 can now undertake live assessments with experienced LCME examiners, exactly as they would in a traditional face-to-face setting but conducted from their own homes.

Recorded Exams

- Available in most music subjects at all grade levels
- Submission of a video recording of technical work, performances and discussion responses
- Does not include sight reading or aural assessment
- Content can be recorded on phone or tablet
- Backing tracks and accompaniment

The LCME Online Exam

In partnership with the International School of Musicians (ISOM)

- Available in all our subjects.
- Candidates and centres do not need any specialist equipment to conduct the online exam. All you will need is a laptop, tablet and a webcam.
- The exam consists of the same components as an LCME face-to-face exam; there is no added preparation and no added stress. Candidates can continue to prepare as they have been doing.
- The ISoM Team will conduct a Connectivity Call with candidates/centres before the examination to ensure candidates are confident with the technology.

- The International School of Musicians (ISoM) is passionate about removing the barriers to music education for everyone.
- ISoM has pioneered an online platform that enables candidates to connect with their examiner from anywhere in the world in real-time, making music education **more accessible for everyone**.



LCME Online Exams – How they work.

1. Before your exam, candidates will be sent the video link. By clicking this on the day of the exam, they will join the video call with the examiner.

2. Once the video call has started, the examiner will introduce themselves, and will ask a few questions confirming the candidate's full name and date of birth.

3. Before the exam starts, the examiner will make sure the candidate is comfortable and that they can see and hear the examiner properly.

4. When the candidate is ready, the exam will officially start.

5. Once the exam has followed the structure, mirroring the face to face exam, the examiner will thank the candidate and confirm that they can leave the call.
