Aside from tirelessly advocating for Canadian music, when the Canada Music Week Festival was first launched in 2019, Sean Bickerton and the Canadian Music Centre on Davie Street opened their doors and provided us with a venue to get the new project off the ground. Sean could not be here but he sends his best.

The representatives from Showcase Pianos could not be here today, but we thank them for the use of their recital space, most recently for the BC Piano Competition Selection event held last month.

Part of the preparation for this afternoon's celebration entailed search out those individuals who had volunteered to serve on the Branch's Board of Directors in the past. These teachers worked hard to maintain our programs and steer the organization throughout the years, and we would like to thank them all for their efforts.

Not every past president could be present but there are several who sent their greetings and a number who have joined us in person. I'm very happy to be able to acknowledge them individually.

Marjorie Hougham was elected President in 1984 and is currently living in Campbell River, she is 97! She was instrumental in getting our Branch back on track after a difficult decade and was chair of the CFMTA Convention in 1985.

Marilyn Glazer was not able to be here but she sends her best. She joined the BCRMTA in 1986 and immediately became the SPG Chair. She remained on the Board until five years ago and is enjoying her retirement in False Creek.

Marlene Sharman became President in 1988 and is now living in Qualicum Beach. She was not able to attend but she sends warm greetings to her colleagues and friends. Marlene was always a calming presence and she led the Branch with great skill.

Dr. Rita Steblin was elected President in 1990 but moved to Austria part way through her presidency. She passed away suddenly in 2019 but she left behind an impressive legacy of musicological research.

Dorothy U. and Marlene Sharman took over when Rita emigrated in 1991. Dorothy also served as Branch Treasurer and her willingness to step forward unexpectedly was appreciated.

Ria Csapo was the next President starting in 1992. Ria initiated several large scale events including the Musical Soirée and the Gala Dinner with guest Maestro Peter McCoppin, both programs are available on the *Pamphlet and Program Table*.

Lester Soo was the President for four years starting in 1995. He continues to do well and is off in an exotic locale but he sends his best to all.

John Dupuis served as President for one year in 2003, taking over from Amy Levinson who left part way through her term. He is living in Europe and sends his regards but was not able to coordinate a stop in Vancouver during a recent trip to Canada.

Rebecca Cheng was President in 2004 and she continues to be a vibrant presence in our community. She has volunteered in many positions on the Executive and is currently the Venue/Piano Coordinator on the SPG Committee.

In 2006, Sharon West and Marilyn Glazer worked together as co-presidents. Like many of our other Presidents, Sharon served in several roles before taking on the presidency, all with great style and competence.

Jammy Smith and Keiko Alexander continued the tradition of co-presidency in 2011 until Keiko moved back to Chicago in 2012. Keiko could not attend today but was delighted to hear of our celebration and sends her congratulations. Jammy continued on the Executive after her presidency and chaired the 2016 Convention Committee. She remains a trusted resource on the Board and she has recently taken the position of 2nd Vice President on the Provincial Council.

Toni Meyer served on the Board as Treasurer and SPG Chair before taking on the presidency in 2014. Through her efforts, the Branch was able to accumulate the resources to support the programs we are currently offering. Toni is now enjoying a lighter teaching load interspersed with trips abroad to visit her grandchildren.

Barbara Siemens was elected as President in 2018. From an early start with the STA in 1988, she moved up to the parent branch in 1990 and continued to serve for many years. She remains on the Board in several roles and currently stands as 1st Vice President of the Provincial Council.

We are also pleased that several past Executive members are able to join us today. To the following teachers we send an enormous thank you for all your time and effort on behalf of our Association: Martha Brickman, Marnie Carter, Daisy Chu, Ross Curran, Ljiljana Jorgacevic, Sharon Kirk, Mary McKinney, Keiko Parker, and Elisabeta Podut.

I would also like to acknowledge the teachers and their students who provided our entertainment today, please check page 39 for a complete listing. When the planning began for the event six months ago, we did not know what limitations covid would create, so we opted for video versus live music. As we move past health restrictions, the Branch is very much looking forward to more in-person events.

I would like to close my acknowledgments by thanking those volunteers who are on the current Board of Directors. This extensive list is noted on page 50 of this Scrapbook and we are thrilled that each of them has joined the group. Together we make a formidable collective, one that supports and enriches the musical experience in our community for teachers and students alike.

#### Why We Teach Music - Author unknown

We teach music:

Not because we expect our students to major in music,

Not because we expect them to play or sing all their lives (although that would be lovely),

Not so they can relax and have fun (also admirable goals),

But:

So they will be human, and recognize beauty,

So they will be closer to an infinite beyond this world,

So they will have something to cling to,

So they will have more love, more compassion, more gentleness, more good, in short more life.

For of what value will it be to make a prosperous living, unless they know how to live a rich and fulfilled life.



My name is Barbara Siemens and it has been my honour to lead the Centennial Planning Committee over the past year.

In the Spring of 2020, I was just beginning my second term as President. One of the goals of the Executive was to create a page on our website detailing the Branch's history and since I had the Archives from the previous President, Toni Meyer, I decided to start going through the box. That's when I came across a copy of the *Certificate of Registration* you see posted on the *Wall of History*. Believe it or not, that is when we realized it was our 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary year. We came very close to missing it!

There was some ambiguity in the records as to the year of the formation. On the one hand, the first meeting of the "Vancouver Teachers" was held in November 1920 with the 40<sup>th</sup> and 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversaries celebrated in 1960 and 1970 respectively. On the other hand, the Society was not officially registered until April 1921 and the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary was marked in 1996. We were fortunate to have some choice as to when we should celebrate, 2020 or 2021.

Covid restrictions were in place in June 2020 and a big gathering was out of the question, so instead the Executive opted to host online events in the Fall. All BCRMTA members were invited to participate and teachers from across the Province joined in. The first event featured the ever-charming Jon Kimura Parker in a Q&A session on September 14. Next was a CMW

Composers' Forum on November 22 featuring Christine Donkin, Alexina Louie and David L. McIntyre. Finally, in January/February 2021 the Branch hosted six workshops on a variety of national and international musical exam systems.

Eventually, there would be an in-person event and knowing this, I decided to explore the history of our Branch in more detail, you see the results in our Wall of History. The information was collected from two sources. The first was the Vancouver/Burnaby Branch Archives which contain the minutes, financial records, and a collection of pamphlets dating back to 1982. The second was the BCRMTA Provincial Council Minutes and Newsletters located in the Provincial Archives in Victoria, these records date back to 1920. Unfortunately, neither of these sources presents a complete picture of our Branch. Our own archives only go back four decades and there are several years missing within that time frame. The Provincial Minutes are more detailed but they focus on Provincial actions and our Vancouver delegates did not always send in Branch reports to include in the newsletters. Still, if the local and Provincial records are combined, a timeline of the Branch's development over the past century comes into focus.

All of the major events and lists presented on the *Wall of History* are included in the Centennial Scrapbook. So, rather than going over dates etc., I'd like to highlight some of the more entertaining moments and share a little gossip from days gone by.

Initially the Vancouver branch included teachers from Burnaby, New Westminster, the North Shore, Richmond, and Surrey. There were nine districts province wide and together the lower mainland centres were District 2. In 1962, the Surrey members started their own branch and in 1971 Richmond and the North Shore left us as well. Between the fluctuations of our boundaries and an increase in the general population, since 1940 the Vancouver Branch has had between 140 and 250 members, we are currently at close to 180.

Reports and articles in the historical records are sometimes quite amusing. On January 31, 1942 our branch had a gathering with a turkey dinner and entertainment. The guest speaker was Dr. J. E. Ewing who delighted his audience on the subject of "Stupidity". The report does not specify of whom or what he was speaking but I'm sure his presentation produced some chuckles. After dinner, 171 members and their friends enjoyed a program of games, fortune telling, and a magician with all proceeds in aid of the *War Fund*.

There are reminders in the records that its prudent to stay in good standing to avoid being mentioned in the permanent record. However, even the best of us can slip and we have an example in black and white! In 1951, the venerable Jean Lyons, formerly of Powell River then residing in Vancouver, was three years in arrears. The Provincial Registrar's report notes that Ms. Lyons requested information as to how to become reinstated as she owed \$10.50, \$7.50 of which was the Vancouver Branch's dues for the past year.

It will come as no surprise to some of you, that BCRMTA and specifically the Vancouver Branch was not always happy with the CFMTA. Apologies to Lois (present as CFMTA Treasurer) but I will say that things are much better now! In 1965 and again in 1966, the Province officially complained of their fees. In 1975, the subject came up again and Vancouver put forward a motion that the BCRMTA secede from the national association. It was defeated but we persisted and the following year our Delegate put forward a motion for the Vancouver Branch members to stop paying their CFMTA fees all together. This too was defeated but the general goal of the Executive was achieved and the record states that the CFMTA "was finally aware of their precarious position".

Our 40th Anniversary was celebrated with considerable pomp and circumstance according to the program from 1960, but the 50th was not so formal. There was indeed a banquet at the Coach House Inn in North Vancouver on May 10, 1970, and Eleanor Harkness née Patch was the chair of the organizing committee. However, the emphasis was on light-hearted fun and a little bit surprising for those of us who remember Eleanor. There was a sing-song where ladies wore "charming period style dress", and a series of Polynesian and Malayan dance performances in full regalia. Is sounds like quite a variety show. Not everyone was amused, though, and in the next Provincial newsletter the Provincial President Alf Carlson (who could be quite biting at times) wrote, "This reporter felt there could have been a bit more of a serious look in retrospect at the reason for the event. No

one, perhaps likes long speeches, but there was nary a word about why we had gathered though the cards and table decorations mentioned it." I hope we've struck an appropriate balance for the 100<sup>th</sup> today, we'll have to see what the next Branch report says.

Aside from the 50th Anniversary celebration, the early 1970's was not a good time for our Branch. If you've had a chance to read the STA and the SPG information you now know that the former dissolved in 1970 and the latter was put on hold for a year. From what I can gather, there were two strong personalities on our Executive, Morris Dean the President and Jack Archibald the Treasurer. In fact, a retired member recently told me, that when she first came to Vancouver in the late 1960's and began teaching, she was warned off joining the Branch because of internal feuding between these two men. Shortly after the 50th Anniversary Banquet, there was a special Branch meeting called to deal with accusations of financial impropriety on the part of the Treasurer. A presentation was made and members satisfied themselves that "all funds were fully accounted for and that the finances were handled properly". An apology was issued but there must still have been some very hard feelings. Shortly afterwards, Jack Archibald set up a whole new Executive to pass resolutions and conduct banking, by-passing the legitimately elected Executive which included Eleanor Harkness and Nan Gorringe.


The situation obviously resolved itself in favour of the rightfully elected members, as Jack Archibald was not mentioned again in subsequent Provincial Council minutes. Early in my RMT membership, I do remember attending a Branch meeting in the basement of St Giles Church on 41st and Cambie. At the end of this particular AGM, Eleanor Harkness stood and thanked the Executive, saying "... it does my heart good to see the Organization in such good hands and in such a fine state".

History tells us who we are, it reminds us of our past and informs our decisions for our future. I am grateful for the chance to have revisited moments in the Vancouver/Burnaby Branch story and to have read about the dedicated people who are now retired or passed away but who I remember from when I as a young teacher. In another 25, 50, or even 100 years, I hope that the records we've created for today will do the same for all the volunteers who carry on the grand and musical tradition that is the Vancouver/Burnaby Branch of the BCRMTA.





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The Vancouver/Burnaby Branch was very pleased to offer five Memorial Raffle Prizes to our guests. The honourees, Winfried Rompf, Donna Fishwick, Linda Niamath, Mary Tickner, and Eleanor Harkness, each made significant contributions to the Branch and to the musical community in general. 

ATTRIORDIMARY EMOCUTION OF WINCOUVER MUSIC TRACETED

At a general meeting of the members of Vancouver Music .

Teachers Association duly convened and held at the First Congregational Church, Corner Thurslow and Pendrall Streets, Vancouver British Columbis on the 9th day of April 1923 the following .

"That the mans of the Boolety be changed to the British Columbia Music Teachers Federation".

- 1920 The Vancouver Music Teachers'
  Association is formed to "help the progressive teacher and protect, as far as possible, the public and the student". The first meeting is held on November 24, in the Board of Trade Building in Vancouver.
- 1922 The group's name is altered to B.C. Music Teachers' Federation to affiliate with other branches across the Province.
- 1932 The Provincial body is formed and the B.C. Music Teachers' Federation becomes the Vancouver Branch of the Provincial Federation. The Vancouver Branch hosts a Conference for the BCMTF in July 1932.
- 1935 Ratification of the Canadian Federation of Music Teachers' Association CFMTA necessitates a change of the Provincial body to British Columbia Music Teachers' Association.
- 1936 In July 17-18, the Vancouver Branch hosts the first CFMTA with the assistance of other branches. The event is a huge success with a "healthy profit of \$50"!
- 1941 The Student Performers' Guild Festival is formed.
- 1947 The Registered Music Teachers' Bill is filed with the BC Provincial Government. A celebration dinner is held at the Canadian Memorial Church in Vancouver on April 12.
- 1955 The Vancouver Branch hosts the CFMTA Convention.

- 1957 Twilight Recitals are initiated by Mrs.
  Grace Wallace. The events raise funds
  and are held every Saturday afternoon
  from February to May with a variety of
  instrument.
- 1962 The Student Teachers Auxiliary is formed.
- 1966 The Vancouver Branch hosts the Provincial Convention.
- 1970 A Celebration Banquet is held in honour of the Branch's 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary at the Coach house Inn in North Vancouver, however, the Branch is thrown into turmoil by conflict between two Executive members and their respective supporters.
- 1985 The Vancouver Branch hosts the CFMTA Convention.
- 1996 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary the Branch celebrates with a commission from local composer Ramona Luengen. Entitled "Bonne Fête!", this intermediate piano piece has hints of "Happy Birthday" and is featured in the SPG Canadian Class.
- 2016 The Vancouver Branch hosts the B.C. Convention Music Where We Belong.
- 2018 The name is change to Vancouver/Burnaby Branch.
- 2019 The Canada Music Week Festival is launched.
- 2020 Our Centennial!!

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

The Vancouver/Burnaby Branch's Student Performers' Guild Festival (SPG) has a long and proud history. For over 80 years it has nurtured young musicians on a variety of instruments, mostly piano but also voice, violin, guitar, and accordion.

The SPG began in 1941 under the direction of Ida Verral and the inaugural event featured 37 entries in piano, violin, and voice. It continued to expand for thirty years, reaching a high of 690 participants in 1970 with added classes for accordion, guitar, folksong and cello. Unfortunately, everything came to a halt in 1970/1971 when the SPG was affected by turmoil in the Branch Executive. It resumed in 1972, albeit in a smaller form, with 400 entries in piano, vocal, accordion and guitar. By 1975, the Festival was reported to have a higher portion of senior entries and an improved standard of

playing overall. In 1980, a new class for blind students was added to the syllabus with a special workshop by blind pianist Linda Jentsch.

The SPG was held in November during Canada Music Week until 2015 when it expanding to an additional Festival in May. This proved to be a more popular time slot and in 2016 the Festival shifted to a single event in May. From 2018 to 2020 the SPG was on hiatus while restructuring occurred, but it returned in February of 2021 with an online form to cope with Covid restrictions.

Numerous dedicated individuals have kept the SPG Festival running smoothly throughout the years. The Branch offers its sincere thanks to the Chairs as well as the Committee members and volunteers who have participated!

The Vancouver/Burnaby Branch of the BCRMTA has had an active Student Teacher Auxiliary (STA) for decades. While the group has fluctuated in its membership, it has consistently mirrored the parent branch with monthly meetings, guest speakers, and student recitals.

The first hint of the STA came in 1952, when a Vancouver Branch delegate reported to the Provincial Council that, "Our members seem to favour adding an Auxiliary section to the Branch". After this concise statement, the topic did not surface again until 1959 when Provincial delegates were asked to take the question of a proposed Auxiliary program back to their members.

The wheels of change moved more quickly this time. At the 1960 Provincial Council meeting, Eleanor Harkness of the Vancouver Branch moved, "That any branch that feels the time is opportune to organize a Student Teacher Auxiliary be allowed to proceed". There were still no specifics, but from this point, it seems that the Vancouver Branch STA was either already formed, or at the least close to being established. Either way, the Branch's report to Council in 1962 stated that, "The Vancouver Branch of the STA is functioning most successfully, regular meetings are being held".

Apparently, the Vancouver STA's success inspired other Branches to form their own groups. In 1966, the Provincial Council suggested that an outline of the Vancouver STA be sent to all branches to help initiate their own programs, and in 1967 a freshly minted BCRMTA Student Teacher Auxiliary Constitution was proposed. This one-page statement outlined the objects of the group, the membership criteria, the bylaws, and the annual fee per member of \$4.00!

1970 was marked with highs and lows for the BCRMTA. While the September Council meeting saw the adoption of the Provincial STA Guidelines, it was a stressful time for the Vancouver Branch and the STA was one of the casualties. The group collapsed and was refashioned in March 1971 as an "Advanced Students' Club" with a focus on performance instead of pedagogy. This situation continued until 1980 when the STA was reformed with eleven members. In 1984, the Vancouver Delegate to the Provincial Council reported that the STA group was once again going strong with fourteen members who held monthly meetings and two recitals a year. The STA has continued in more or less the same fashion to the present day, supported by the parent Branch with a succession of dedicated Liaisons.

#### 1985 CFMTA Convention Program

In 1985, the Vancouver Branch hosted the CFMTA Convention "Yesterday, Today, and Tomorrow" at the UBC School of Music.
